Submission Guidelines

- (1) Once you submit an abstract, you don't need to submit a full paper.
- (2) Selected best papers from the conference will be placed in an expedited review process for the *International Journal of Tourism Research* (SSCI-listed, impact factor 4.737) and *Tourism Management Perspectives* (SSCI-listed, impact factor 7.608).
- (3) There will be a separate competition session of group presentation (up to 3 members per group) among each of **undergraduate students and master's degree students**. Best groups would be selected with certificate. Each group needs to pay US\$150 for participation per group.

Conference Venue

The conference venue (Thammasat University city campus, and the Centra by Centara Hotel Bangkok (Phra Nakhon)) is located within 10 minutes from the most famous and must-see tourist attraction in Thailand, the Grand Palace.



The conference is to be held at one of the most prestigious universities in Thailand, Thammasat University, which is Thailand's second oldest university, established as the National University of Thailand in 1934. It began as an open university, with 7,094 students studying law and politics in its first year.
